

Descriptive writing	Critical analytical writing
States what happened	Identifies the significance
States what something is like	Evaluates strengths and weaknesses
Gives the story so far	Weighs one piece of information against another
States the order in which things happened	Makes reasoned judgements
Says how to do something	Argues a case according to evidence
Explains what a theory says	Shows why something is relevant or suitable
Explains how something works	Indicates why something will work (best)
Notes the method used	Indicates whether something is appropriate or suitable
Says when something occurred	Weighs up the importance of component parts
States the different components	Gives reasons for selecting each option
States options	Evaluates the significance of details
Lists details	Structures information in order of importance
Lists in any order	Shows the relevance of links between pieces of information
Gives information	Draws conclusions
